Our sisters of the Alpha Chapter at the University of California at Los Angeles recently lost one of their own to Cystic Fibrosis. Recent graduate and alumna, Rachel Khattar, wrote this moving article about their dear sister, Jessica Fredrick.

"Spirit lead me where my frust is without borders. Let me walk upon the waters, wherever you would call me. Take me deeper than my feet could ever wander and my faith will be made stronger, in the presence of my. Savior." Our sister J-Fred did not just say this but lived this to the point even those who didn't get the blessing of knowing her as well as some, were affected by the ripple of her Christ-Chasing life. It is not about the amount of people that Jess shone Christ's love to, but the depth. Though the numbers of people are countless, she was truly a mirror of the joy Christ gives His children, to the point where people asked why. Jess loved God so recklessly, that she carried her earthy burdens with pride and a joy that only deepened with every step.

It didn't make sense to me, and then I realized that her joy was from a place that her feet could not wander or their own. Because of her trust in Christ, the spirit was leading her to where there are no borders. God allows these challenges we can't handle on our own, because the wants us to ling to Him for help.



At the beautiful celebration of her life, her sister shared that Jess saw CF as the cross that God allowed her to carry and that He in turn took on infinitely more in her place. It really was a badge, a daily reminder or Christ's forgiveness; not just for her, but for everyone she shared her God-given joy with. Though the distance makes it difficult to remain focused on the fact that, "To die was to gain and to live was Christ." For Jess, as she gained, she continues to ripple Christ through everyone that is blessed through her intentional, inspiring, and Christ-chnered life.

I could not help but ask God why her and not me. The answer is simple: she ran her race, she finished strong, so she has been welcomed home as a good and faithful servant. Our race is not over, we have yet to cross the finish line, our purpose here has not been satisfied. To live is Christ, so let us do just that.
